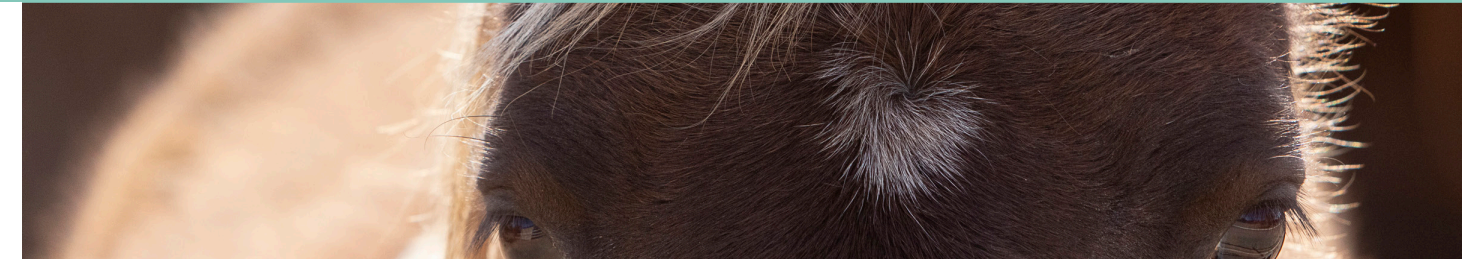

# dear friends



**2024 was a pivotal year** in The Horse Shelter's history, with unique challenges and achievements for our organization. From October of 2023 to the beginning of 2024, we took in 30 free-roaming horses from the NM Livestock Board to keep them from going to slaughter. Most of these horses were age 3, with the oldest being 9.

These horses are uniquely challenging for our organization, as the handling skills and training they require are much more extensive and necessitate specific skills from our trainers. To our regret, early in 2024, our onsite saddle trainer decided to start her own business; although she still takes some of our horses into training, we were left searching for the right person with the right skills to help us on site. In May of 2024, we were able to hire our new onsite trainer, but our training progress was already severely delayed, which, on top of the slow progress these horses usually make, affected our adoption

numbers. Unhandled horses require much more training time and skills, as the process from socialization for them to begin to trust and approach people, to halter training, to groundwork training and then finally saddle training can easily take a year, or more. As horses can live to be well over 30 years, the investment in training them is well justified and these young horses deserve a chance for a good life.

Of course, some of the free-roaming mares we had taken in foaled in May, June and July. Early July a mountain lion killed two of our newborns and we were faced with not only the trauma and heartbreak of that event but also with the need to predator-proof our property to keep the rest of our vulnerable population safe. This was the first such incident in the 24 years we have occupied this property.

In September, we finalized the acquisition of the 128-acre property. We had been working

and saving toward this goal for years and were thrilled to now be able to start on much-needed capital improvements that will perpetuate our ability to serve the horses of New Mexico.

We spent the year's final quarter working on updating the property and addressing some infrastructure issues. Also, we have added predator-proof enclosures for our young and vulnerable horses to overnight safely. We are working on a master plan that will include more onsite housing, a covered riding arena, and more predator-proof areas.

So many of our supporters have stepped up and helped us by donating and sponsoring our horses to help them transform from free roaming to good equine citizens. We appreciate the support from donors, adopters and volunteers and continue to strive to help more horses in need.

# the nuts and bolts of our operation

The Horse Shelter is located on 128 stunning acres in Cerrillos, New Mexico, 20 minutes south of Santa Fe. We have quarantine areas for new arrivals and have a total capacity to shelter 100 horses onsite. We have stallion pens, chute systems, and medical pens that allow the safe vetting and evaluation of new intakes, and they were built to accommodate the increasing number of untamed horse intakes. 45 paddocks ranging up to 5 acres in size, a 20-plus acre turnout, an outdoor riding arena and bullpen for training, a 3,000 square-foot barn, a tack room, a community room with kitchen facilities, an office building, and a mechanical shop. All holding areas have safe pipe fencing, and the larger turnouts incorporate some smooth wire and electric tape fencing. We have natural cover through trees and three-sided run-in shelters within the paddocks. Our trainer lives on-site for around-the-clock care as needed. Four full-time and five part-time ranch staff care for our 95 horses, assisted by on-call professionals such as veterinarians, farriers and vet techs.

# lucy's transformation journey



*Lucy was brought to us in March of 2024. She arrived bone thin and in serious need of nourishment.*

We ended the year with 93 horses onsite, 30 of which we had taken in late 2023 and early 2024 and they were all feral/free-roaming and had not been handled by humans before. Most of them are very young and deserve the investment of time, expense and effort for them to be able to become desirable adoptees. These horses would have been shipped to slaughter if we had not stepped up to take them. Having so many unhandled horses slowed down our adoptions, as this process, from socialization to undersaddle

training, can take one to two years for many of these horses. We also experienced high staff turnover at the ranch. Nonetheless, our horses thrived and are being worked with by staff and volunteers to help them in their transformation process. Watching these horses transform from skinny to healthy, from feral to domesticated and from rescue to being loved by their new owners is very rewarding and affirms our mission as equine rescue.

The Horse Shelter is an active participant in this video and onsite training program for volunteers and adopters, which is spearheaded by Trevor Carter and instructs beginner horse handlers from the ground up on safety and natural horsemanship techniques. Our volunteers can access training videos and then apply that knowledge in our onsite classes with our horses. This program has dramatically enhanced our volunteer's abilities to handle our horses with the same consistent training cues. Our horses greatly benefit from the groundwork they learn and the socialization they receive from our volunteers.

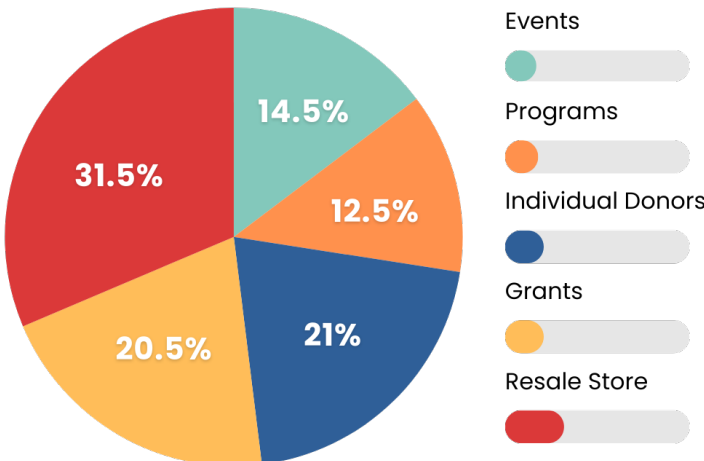

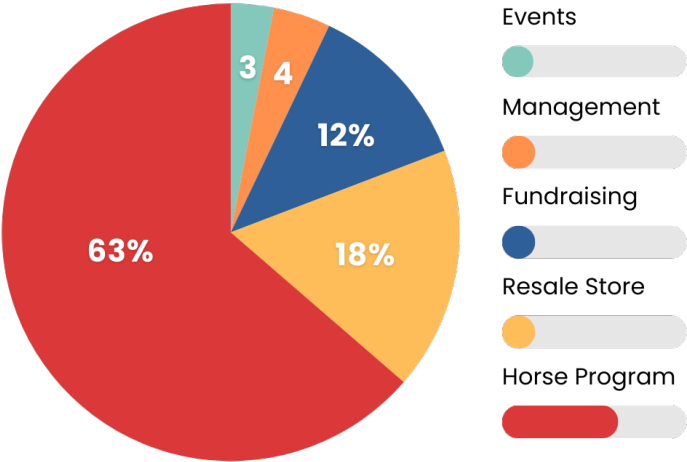
