As we reflect on 2025, my heart is full of gratitude for this incredible community that continues

to stand beside The Horse Shelter and the horses who depend on us.

This year has been one of meaningful progress and steady commitment. Thanks to your support, we made significant improvements at the ranch, including major updates to our roadways to ensure safer access year-round and important upgrades to our fire mitigation systems to better protect the horses and our facilities. Living in a high-risk area, these improvements are not just enhancements — they are essential safeguards for the lives in our care.

We reached full capacity this year, providing sanctuary to 100 horses. That number represents not just space, but safety, nourishment, training, and daily compassion. Even while continuing to care for many unhandled horses who came to us the previous year — requiring

extra time, patience, and training — we proudly celebrated 20 adoptions in 2025. Each adoption is a reminder of why we do this work and what is possible when preparation meets opportunity.

Our annual auction fundraiser was another bright spot. The generosity, energy, and enthusiasm surrounding the event were truly inspiring. It was a wonderful success — not just financially, but in the way it brought our community together around a shared mission.

The Horse Shelter is located on 128 stunning acres in Cerrillos, New Mexico, 20 minutes south of Santa Fe. We have quarantine areas for new arrivals and have a total capacity to shelter 120 horses onsite. We have stallion pens, chute systems, and medical pens that allow the safe vetting and evaluation of new intakes, and they were built to accommodate the increasing number of untamed horse intakes. 45 paddocks ranging up to 5 acres in size, a 20-plus acre turnout, an outdoor riding arena and bullpen for training, a 3,000 square-foot barn, a tack room, a community room with kitchen facilities, an office building, and a mechanical shop. All holding areas have safe pipe fencing, and the larger turnouts incorporate some smooth wire and electric tape fencing. We have natural cover through trees and three-sided run-in shelters within the paddocks. Our trainer lives on-site for around-the-clock care as needed. Four full-time and five part-time ranch staff care for our 100+ horses, assisted by on-call professionals such as veterinarians, farriers and vet techs.

MAPPING THE FUTURE FOR NEW MEXICO'S HORSES

After purchasing the ranch in September 2024, we began making much-needed improvements to our roadways and invested in critical fire mitigation measures, including installing underground water storage tanks, a fire draft hydrant, and a fire alert system in the hay barn to better protect the horses and infrastructure. We also drilled a new livestock well, generously funded by a \$100,000 grant from our donor, Jackie Counter. At the same time, we launched focused strategic planning sessions to thoughtfully map out the ranch's next chapter. Together, we are evaluating enhancements to our quarantine and medical facilities, exploring the addition of a covered arena for year-round training, and identifying expanded programs and partnerships that will allow us to help even more horses throughout New Mexico.

The Challenges of Horse Rescue

and the Work Behind Every Transformation Story



One of the most challenging aspects of our work at The Horse Shelter is the condition of the horses in need of rescue in New Mexico. Many are found free-roaming or seized on cruelty charges. They often arrive at THS in very poor condition and are completely untrained.

Some horses are emaciated and have severely overgrown hooves. Others arrive with wounds or untreated medical conditions. Most require extensive veterinary, dental, and farrier care, along with careful nutritional rehabilitation to regain a healthy body weight. This initial recovery process alone can take six months or more.

Once a horse is physically rehabilitated, another significant challenge begins: training. Many of the horses we receive have had little to no positive human handling. Training is essential to ensure they can be safely and successfully rehomed. Even companion (non-riding) horses must learn the basics to become

safe, well-behaved equine citizens. At a minimum, they need to halter, lead, stand quietly for the veterinarian and farrier, and load into a trailer.

Many of the horses that come to us are young and have the potential to become good riding partners. These horses also receive under-saddle training to prepare them for adoptive homes.

The full process of refeeding, rehabilitation, and training often takes well over a year. Because horses can live into their 30s, this investment in their care and education is invaluable. Proper training not only increases their adoptability but is vital to ensuring they remain in safe, loving homes for the rest of their lives.

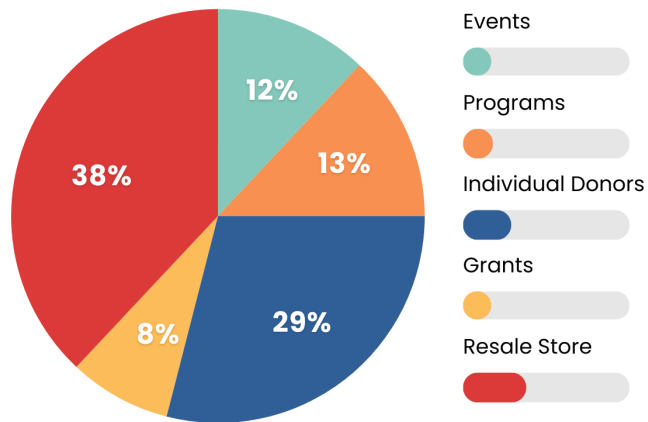
We are thrilled to share that in 2025, 78 generous sponsors are now supporting 73 of our horses, providing them with care, healing, and sanctuary at our ranch.

Together, these sponsorships generated \$126,641 in total income, directly supporting our horses' transformation journeys and lifelong well-being. We are humbled and

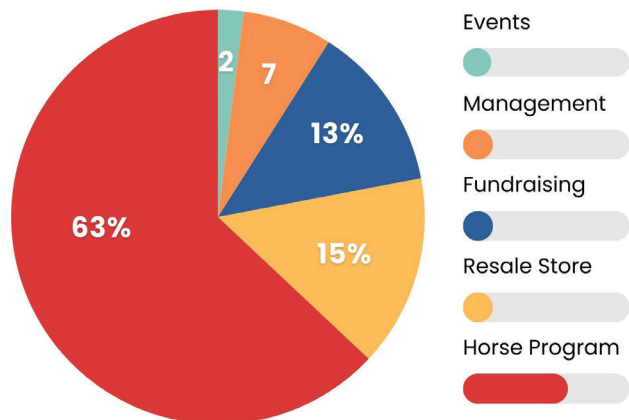
